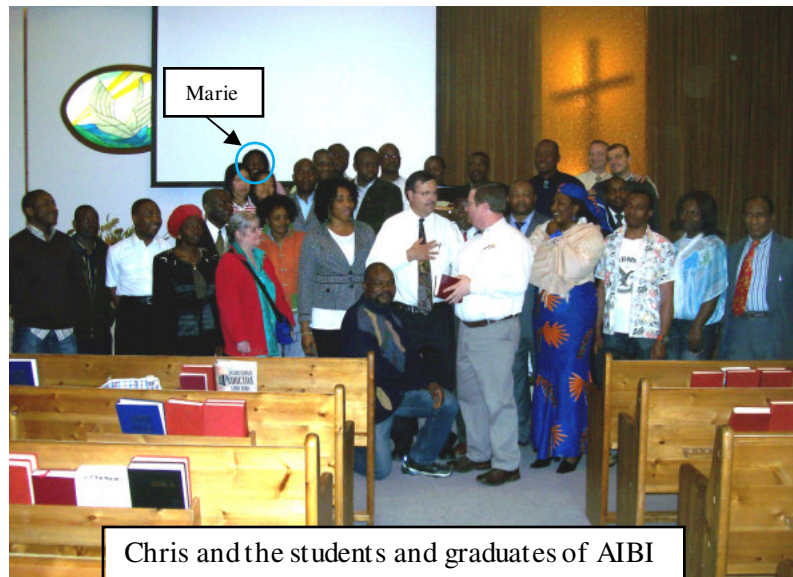

She noticed a frightened young woman sitting in the corner of the room with him. It turns out she was this man's girl-friend. Marie sat with this young woman and young man and prayed with them. He soon passed from this life. Unfortunately his part of this tragic story is ended.
